Post Office Closure Programme

Post Office Ltd's six week public consultation on post office closures in Ayrshire, Inverclyde, Lanarkshire and Renfrewshire commenced on 22nd July 2008.

Post Office Ltd has proposed the closure of 44 branches in this area, replacing a further 7 branches with outreach services.

North Lanarkshire areas are:

Airdrie & Shotts, Coatbridge & Bellshill, Cumbernauld, Motherwell & Wishaw.

As a group who represents the right of disabled individuals, we are particularly worried about the most vulnerable members of the affected communities who may not be fit or able to make the necessary journey to their nearest Post Office branch, which in some cases may involve using public transport and the problems that can entail.

North Lanarkshire disability Forum have since written a letter and requested we be part of this consultation process. We will of course keep you up to date with our progress.

ACCESS PANEL

At their last meeting on the 17th July 2008 the Access Panel were made aware of the new Public Toilet facility on Kenilworth Avenue in Wishaw. This facility intends to have manned access 6 days a week and unmanned on a Sunday with access by Radar Key (available from your social work offices for £3) There will be a disabled toilet and adult changing facilities.

On the same vein, Bellshill train station have opened new disabled toilets, given that this is a very busy station we are sure this will be good news for all.

DISABLED PARKING BILL

A Bill to make provision for the duties of local authorities in relation to parking places for use by disabled persons' vehicles and connected purposes.

The Bill was introduced on 2nd June 2008. The Bill is currently being considered at Stage 1 and has been referred to the Local Government and Communities Committee, the deadline is 28th November 2008. We hope to update you on the progress of the Bill in our next Newsletter in December.
